About the project

Objectives

- 1. To examine **balancing as a conflict resolution tool**. The need for intervention comes from the feasible or actual conflict, that is considered undesirable. The work explores if and how balancing can be employed to solve the conflicts, but also how to prevent them.
- 2. To make an inventory of the legal tools and methods that may be used to balance interests.
- 3. To understand how legal tools of balancing could be implemented in the context of innovative technologies. Video-based AAL serves as a case study allowing contextualisation of the research.

Key findings

- 1. Balancing is governed by principles, identified in case law of the European Court of Human Rights, and the Court of Justice of the EU.
- 2. Principles of balancing may be translated into steps of balancing method:

3. Balancing as proactive method is a promising tool in the context of innovative tehcnologies like AAL to manage conflicts of interests.
