



## The Protection Mechanism of Health Data

Member States may maintain or introduce further conditions, including limitations, with regard to the processing of genetic data, biometric data or data concerning health.

(Article 9(2)(4) GDPR)

- Racial or ethnic origin
- Political opinions
- Religious or philosophical beliefs
- Trade union membership
- Genetic data
- Biometric data
- Data concerning health
- Sex life or sexual orientation

Sensitive data

The processing of sensitive data is in principle prohibited.

- Explicit consent
- Employment (MS law)
- Vital interest
- Political, philosophical, religious
- Made public
- Substantial public interest (Union or MS law)
- Medical, health, social care (Union or MS law)
- Public health (Union or MS law
- Research (Union or MS law)

**Exceptions** 

Sensitive data can only be processed according to these legal grounds.
